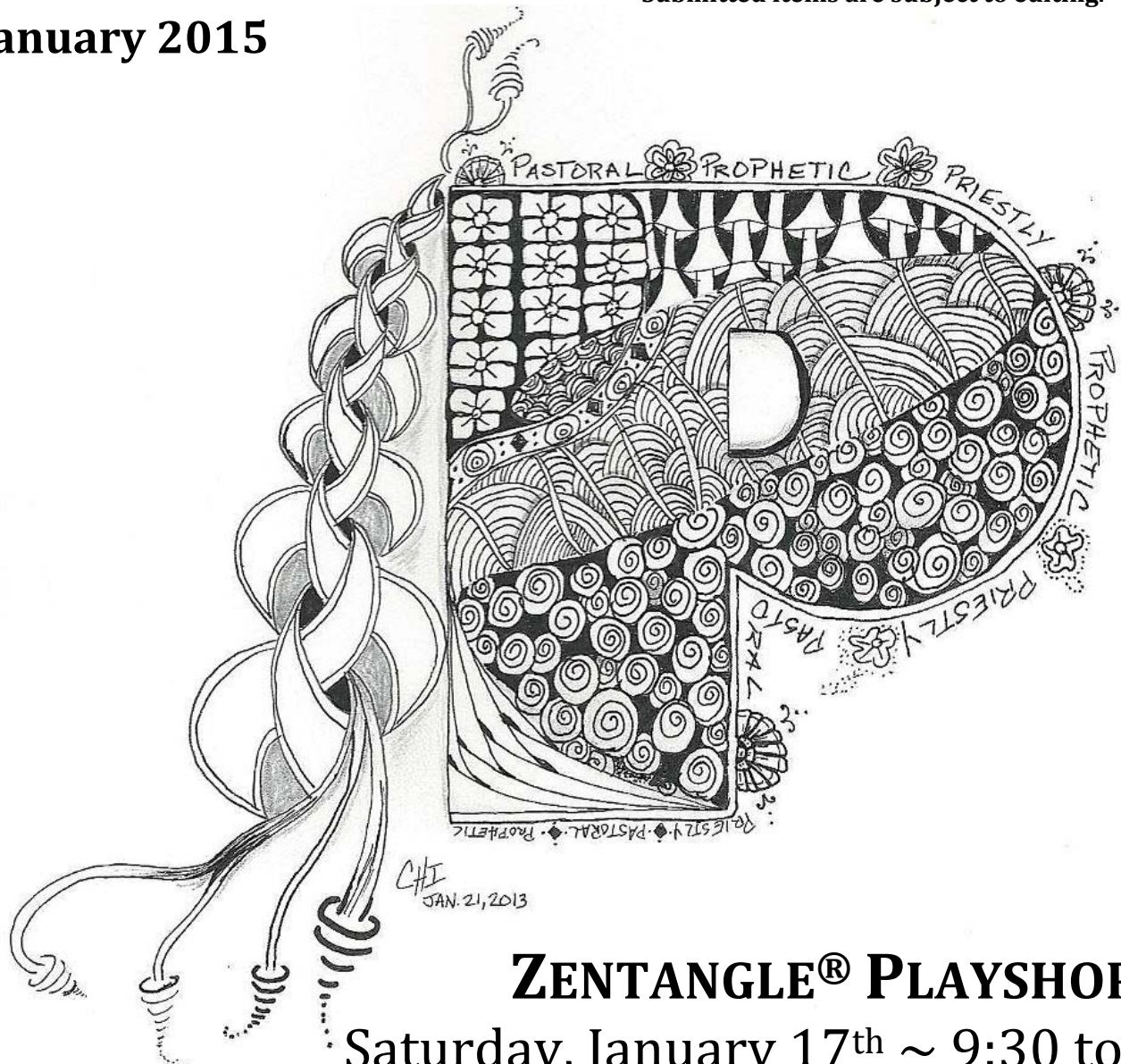

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Ministerial Musings...

INCARNATION (noun \in-(.)kär-'nā-shən\) embodied in flesh or taking on flesh

1 a (1): the embodiment of a deity or spirit in some earthly form (2) *capitalized*: the union of divinity with humanity in Jesus Christ

EMMANUEL (Hebrew עִמָּנוּאֵל) "God is with us"

"And they shall name him Emmanuel, which means God is with us." Matthew 1:23

God is with us, embodied in flesh. W.H. Auden once proclaimed, "Love God in the world of the flesh." When God took on human form and was born as a human child, the value of humanity and all of creation was lifted. We are not merely human, any of us, but also divine; as are our friends, neighbors, and even those folks who annoy us and our enemies. God is with us, and in us, with all people and in every person, making us and our bodies holy; making animals and the earth holy.

Why did God take on human flesh? I have heard so many different answers to this question. I don't think there is a right one. Various answers highlight different facets of God's amazing diversity. One answer that caught me recently suggested that the incarnation is a response not to the problem of our mortality, but to our isolation as human beings.

"What if we reconsider our work and being in the world around the fundamental problem of human isolation? That what we need more than anything is for someone to be with us. Not someone to do something for us. That what we need to do for others in need is be with them. Be present with them. Isn't this exactly why there is an incarnation? Not to solve the problem of mortality, but, for someone, the divine one, to be with us?" Caryn Riswold, Ph.D

Emmanuel, God with us. God is with us. We find God's presence in friends and family, from visits of someone who cares, even sometimes just from a card that arrives just when we need it. We find God's presence when we gather for worship and fellowship; in silence and prayer; in standing up for justice and in a life of service.

God is with us. What if ... what if ... what we need to do for others is to be present with them more than to do something for them? What if, what we need to do for ourselves is to be more present with God, source of all life, source of our strength, our guide, our joy, our rock? God is with us. Are we aware of that?

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION CHANGES

Edwards will be re-filing the Articles of Incorporation with the state of Iowa after approval by the congregation at the annual meeting on February 8, 2015. There are two items changed. The first is the name of our corporation which actually happened 56 years ago when the congregational church merged with others to become the UCC. This change merely codifies the name, “Edwards Congregational United Church of Christ.”

The second change is our method of operation. The original Articles names the clerk as the “Chief Operating officer”, and also names the Board of Trustees as the “Board of Directors.” For many years now our “Chief Operating officer” has been the Moderator, and the “Board of Directors” is what we call the Church Council. This change updates the original articles to correctly reflect our current way of operating.

Copies of the new Articles of Incorporation are available from the secretary, Kathy Bowerman, in the church office (M-F, 9am-2pm). Also available are the proposed and printed changes to the By-Laws. If interested, pick up a copy.

2015 PROPOSED BUDGET

You received by email a Proposed Budget for 2015 in narrative format. It was attached to the Pastor’s Blog sent on 12/12/14. The Trustees and Council present you with this information to bring to your awareness the difference between the vision of our Boards and leaders in ministry and the pledges and estimated giving received so far for 2015. Currently it reflects approximately a \$44,000 difference between our hopes and visions and the funding anticipated. This presents our faith community with an opportunity and a challenge. Please prayerfully review these proposals, these visions, and see if your heart is lead to increase your pledged financial support for the work and mission of Edwards.

We are in the middle of the budgeting process at this time. This is not the final budget. The Trustees and Council will revisit this proposed budget taking into account any updated or new pledges received before the Council meeting in January. A final budget for 2015 will be presented for your consideration one week prior to our Annual Meeting on February 8, 2015.

We hope this lively, descriptive approach will help you connect more closely to the ministries you value, and which your gifts support. Thank you for giving generously to our ministry together.

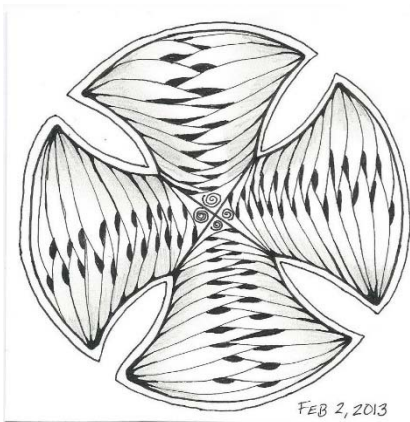

ZENTANGLE® PLAYSHOP

I first learned about Zentangle® at a spiritual renewal retreat. It was introduced to me as a mediation tool. Unlike doodling, which gives our hands something to do while our brain is busy with something else, tangling consumes the hands and mind in a creative process that is meditative, calming and simple. There are no mistakes in Zentangle, the quality of finished product is not the goal. The process of tangling, the intentionality behind each stroke, allowing the brain to slow down, and breathing are the focus.

No drawing or art experience is required! I am not a certified teacher, but I'm interested in sharing with you this meditative tool I have discovered. I have been practicing for over 2 years. The tangle above is one of my own. We will learn about Zentangle, learn several patterns, practice tangling together and have time for questions and answers. You don't need to bring anything to the playshop, all materials are provided with the cost of registration. Scholarships are available, call Pastor Christine at 563-505-0822.

Church Council Highlights

Some highlights from the Church Council meeting held Tuesday, December 9, 2014:

- Rev. Dr. Christine informed Council that Tori VandeZande will be a member in discernment with the support of our congregation.
- Rev. Kendra reported that the Christmas pageant was very well received and that the cookie walk generated nearly \$400, the proceeds of which will be added to the general fund.
- Membership Board reported there are many folks signing up for moveable feasts and more hosts are needed. It was suggested that Baxter Hall could be used to host a moveable feast, provided the host checks with Kathy Bowerman as to its availability.
- Mission Board reported that \$3,000 in food pantry cash donations were received in the first nine months of 2014.
- Endowment Board reported that they had dispensed \$2,800 in local mission funds in cooperation with the Mission Board. The Endowment Board has also set aside nearly \$2,000 to cover some unexpected boiler repair expenses.
- The Treasurer reported that a full-year deficit for 2014 is still probable since we have lost a number of pledges due to deaths, moves or other reasons.
- Trustee Board continues to work with the Treasurer in preparing a 2015 Mission Spending Plan (i.e., the annual budget) for the congregation's review. The 2015 proposed budget will be distributed to the congregation beginning in December. This will provide the congregation with plenty of opportunity to discuss the 2015 Mission Spending Plan in advance of the Annual Meeting on Sunday, February 8.
- Also to be voted on at the Annual Meeting are updated Articles of Incorporation and revisions to the Church's Constitution and By-Laws. Both of these documents will be distributed to the congregation well in advance of the Annual Meeting.
- Under new business, the issue of office security was discussed. Council unanimously voted to install an access control system with intercom for the front door as soon as possible. An access control system will help ensure the safety of those working in the church building during the work week.
- Upcoming dates of interest...
 - January 25, 2015 – Membership Board is planning a cocoa-tasting mixer for new members.
 - February 1, 2015 – Mission Board & Christian Ed are planning to sell lasagna dinners as a fund raiser for Biloxi Mission Trips and Youth Missions.
 - February 8, 2015 – Social Fellowship Board plans to hold a chili potluck in conjunction with the 2015 Annual Meeting.
