

## *From Our Pastor's Desk...*

---

Lent comes early this year - February 6<sup>th</sup> to be exact! I'm still finding stray Christmas decorations around my house, and here we are getting ready for Easter. It doesn't seem right, somehow. But that's what the calendar says, and so - ready or not - Ash Wednesday will begin our preparations for the great celebration of Easter on March 23.

Historically, Lent has been a time when we, as followers of Jesus, remember the sacrifices that he made for us by sacrificing something in our own lives. In the Middle Ages, Christians gave up all meat for the entire season of Lent. In more modern times, the practice of eating fish on Fridays became more common. Some people give up chocolate, or sweets, or other foods that taste good and are tempting (but not necessarily good for us). I know people who give up television or movies or restaurant meals during Lent.

In recent years, I have come to understand Lent differently. I don't think that it is so much a time of deprivation, as it is a time to find some new or renewed discipline that will help to connect me to my faith more deeply and more regularly. It has become - for me - a time to re-focus on prayer and worship, on study and reflection.

This year, I am excited about the ways that we will be doing that together here at Edwards. On Sunday mornings we will focus on the stories of Jesus that have changed the way people understood themselves and God. We will reflect together on the characteristics that build a strong and enduring faith.

Wednesday Evenings at church will be better than ever, I think. Becky David will be leading a time of reflection and worship called *The Wheel of Life*. Someday she will write a book (I hope!), but for now she gives seminars and workshops on the way that life cycles - like a wheel - from good times to struggle and back again. Over the five Wednesdays in Lent, you will have the chance to reflect deeply about the ways in which your life and God's love come together, season by season. Don't miss it!

On Friday, February 15<sup>th</sup>, we will have an opportunity to connect with each other and with the music that makes our faith come alive, as the Chancel Choir, Promised Land, the Friends in Faith Band, and the Alleluia Ringers give a concert to raise funds for new choir robes.

The reality is that most of our lives are too full already, and Lent often feels like one more thing we "have" to do. In order for Lent to become a time when our faith can grow deeper roots, we are invited to empty out some space for whatever new discipline we choose to engage. That might mean that we leave work a little early on Wednesdays - to make space. It might mean that we clean out some of the emotional "clutter" that takes up energy and time - to make space for God to be at work.

Whatever it means in your life, I invite you to make the space and the time to honor Lent this year. It is a journey that will take you to the cross and beyond - to the Easter joy of God's resurrection love. See you in church!



# *Notes from the 2007 Annual Report . . .*

---

## Financial News

From a financial standpoint, 2007 was a good year at Edwards. A year ago, we adopted a budget with a \$16,000 deficit projected, and we ended the year with a \$4,500 surplus! You gave generously, and we have watched our expenses carefully.

As we begin 2008, there are several things to celebrate and highlight.

- ◇ To date all the pledges have not been finalized, but we expect that pledging will increase by at least \$10,000 this year!
- ◇ Watching expenses carefully, we expect to include \$10,000 in the 2008 budget toward pastoral and staff salary increases, which will allow for substantial raises to those staff who are currently underpaid.
- ◇ Our budgeted mission giving continues to remain above 10% of our total annual budget.
- ◇ This year's budgeted deficit is a little more than \$11,000 - which the Church Council believes is within our ability to raise over the course of the year.

## Community Notes

Did you know that -

- 20 people joined with us in membership in 2007?
- There are 8 musical groups that share regularly in our worship services - all of whom are members of Edwards?
- Our Caregiver Coordinator logged 3,048 miles, making 234 visits to members and friends of Edwards in 2007?
- 17 families served as hosts for Coffee Hour throughout the year?
- Our total mission giving (budgeted and special offerings) was over \$37,000 - and if you include the Mission Trip Funds it's more like \$42,000!
- Kay Stiles is our 2008 Moderator, and Tom Kenneke is our Moderator-Elect?
- The Weekday Programs has a new director - Meki Falborg? Stop by and meet her!
