

From Our Pastor's Desk...

One of my great joys as a pastor is to gather with Confirmation youth each week as they explore the meaning of faith and community and service. Last week, the lesson was about the baptism of 3,000 people in Jerusalem at Pentecost, and we reflected together about the meaning of baptism. Only a couple of our youth could remember their baptism - most of them had been baptized as babies. They had pictures. They had candles. But they only had their parents' memories. It's true for most of us.

That night, I stood with twelve Middle School youth in the half-dark sanctuary, and we read together the baptismal promises and the promises of the congregation. Then I told them a story about Martin Luther, who, when he was feeling bad about himself would repeat over and over "I am baptized, I am baptized, I am baptized" - reminding himself of God's eternal love which is named for each of us in our baptism.

Well, to make a long story short, our youth could relate to Martin Luther's feelings, and we ended up saying together - and then shouting - his words. "I am baptized! I am baptized! I am baptized!"

There was true glee in their voices. (You have to admit, shouting in church is fun - and besides, there was a squirt gun involved!) All of us need the reminder, once in a while, that we are loved, blessed, named and claimed. We need to know that we belong and that we matter. And, of course, that is what happens in our baptisms.

Everyone in our culture associates the month of February with Valentine's Day - a time of romance and love. The problem with Valentine's Day, it seems to me, is that not everyone gets to share in the celebration. Not everyone has a sweetheart who can buy chocolates or diamonds or send flowers. Hallmark and the flower shops may love it, but for many it is a time of pain and emptiness.

The love that we know and share in the church is very different. There are no insiders and outsiders. There's just all of us, and God - known to us as Creator, as Jesus, and as the Holy Spirit. We are all baptized into that eternal, amazing, holy, bigger-than-anything-we-can-understand love; gathered into one huge family. No one is more important than another, we all come before God as a baptized child.

Baptism changes who we are and who we will become. In baptism we are called to a bigger and better life of service and truth, and we are given a deep reminder that we will never be alone. Not only has the community marked us with water and prayer, but also the Spirit has touched us with the power of God's holy love.

As we continue the season of Epiphany - when we remember Jesus' baptism and when we celebrate the light of Christ that has come into the world - I invite you to remember your baptism! And SMILE! You are a blessed, beloved child of God!




Staffing Changes


