Ministerial Musings...

Gathered, Affirmed, Called, Forgiven. Those have been our themes in the January sermon series.

God has **GATHERED** us, each one of us to be a part of the faith community at Edwards UCC. We **BELONG** here. We are not here by happenstance, but because God has gathered us. St. Benedict wrote a rule or spiritual guide for his monks and nuns in the 6th century to guide them in every aspect of their lives. It's wisdom has survived through the ages and is still read by Benedictine monks and nuns today. In the Rule of Benedict he writes, "The purpose of Benedictine spirituality is to gather (aha, **GATHER**) equally committed adults for a journey through earthen darkness to a dazzling light that already flames in each of us, but in hidden place left to each of us to find." (p.36) We are gathered for a purpose and that purpose is achieved through service, worship, prayer, stewardship, Bible-study – all manner of things that the church community facilitates.

Just as God **AFFIRMED** Jesus when he was baptized, God affirms each one of us. When we baptize an infant, part of the liturgy reminds us that even before we have chosen God, even before we have loved God, God has loved us. And God's affirmation goes beyond baptism to encompass all of creation as we are reminded in the creation story. Each day as God created, God declared creation good. God affirms us, declares us good, looks on each of us with compassion and calls us God's **BELOVED**.

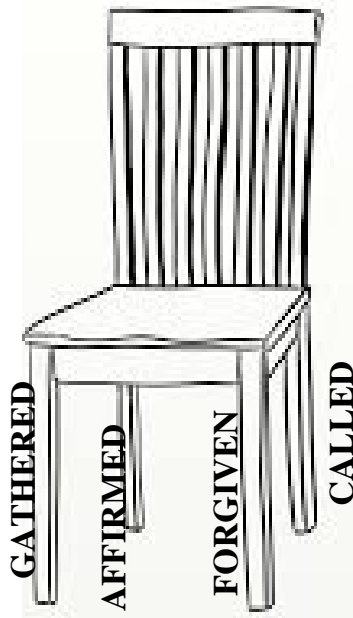
We may not know how many times God has **CALLED** our name and we have thought it was something else or someone else. Just like Samuel who thought Eli was calling him in the night. Each one of us has a part to play within God's kingdom, each one of us has a gift and a skill to offer which will make the world a little bit brighter. Within each of us is divine light and God calls us to let our light shine. Let us **LISTEN** for God's voice, let us expect to hear God calling to us so that we will be attentive to hear God.

All this would be a bit daunting and heavy, it might seem too heavy a burden to bear if it weren't for **FORGIVENESS**. God is always ready with a second chance. Even when Jonah purposefully runs in the opposite direction because as Jonah notes, that is simply God's nature. Jonah 4:2 b "O Lord, is this not what I said when I was still at home? That is why I was so quick to flee to Tarshish. I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love, a God who relents from sending calamity." 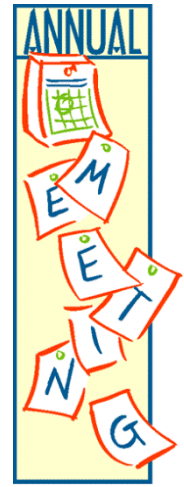

Rehearsals begin **Wednesday, February 25th**. Come for dinner at **5:30pm**, stay for rehearsal/set design **6-7pm**.

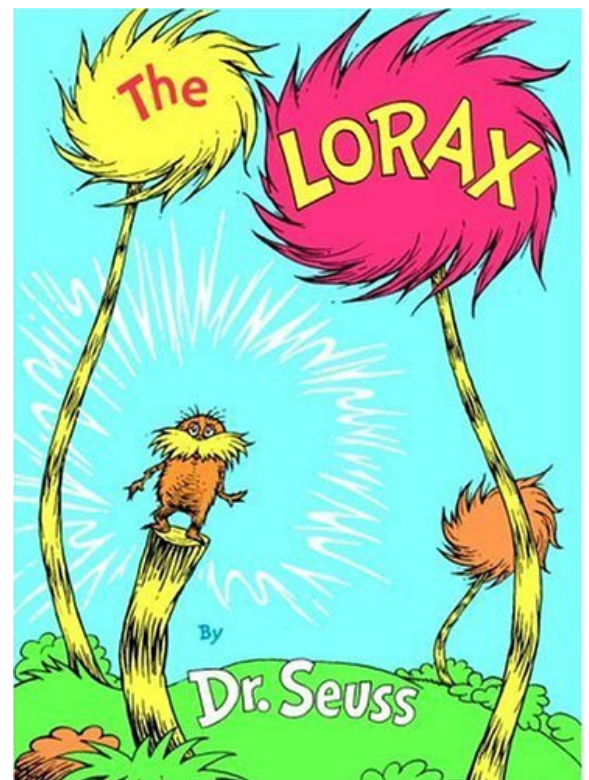

Church Council Highlights

Below are some highlights from the most recent Church Council meeting. If you would prefer to read the Council minutes in their entirety, please contact the church office or visit our website for a copy.

- The Council spent considerable time discussing the not-quite-yet-final financial results for 2014, as well as the outlook for 2015. With respect to last year, it appears we may be able to close out 2014 with just a relatively small deficit of a bit less than \$3,000. That's extremely good news when compared to the \$21,000 deficit the congregation adopted in its original 2014 budget.
- Looking forward, work still needs to be done in finalizing the 2015 budget before it is presented to the congregation at the Annual Meeting on February 8. At the moment, for a variety of different reasons, anticipated 2015 expenses exceed 2015 pledge and non-pledge income by a sizable amount. Council would like to enter 2015 with a balanced budget. Therefore, the Board of Trustees has established a task force to revisit the proposed 2015 budget with the assignment of bringing expected expenses into balance with anticipated income. Balancing the budget is hard and challenging work. And talking about money and financial shortfalls is never a fun conversation. But as Christine reminds us all – **we, as a congregation, are doing good work. We are changing people's lives. We have a challenge before us with a new year and a new budget, but God will make a way. We need to be attentive to God's voice.**
- The family of Rose Marie Edgerton honored her pledge to support the Capital Campaign. For that we should all be very thankful. We might all consider leaving written instructions in our wills, trusts, or with our families regarding how we would like our pledges handled after our deaths.
- Proposed revisions to the By-Laws and Articles of Incorporation are available on the Church's website for all to review. The congregation will be asked to adopt the proposed By-Laws and Articles at the upcoming annual meeting.
- The Nominating Committee, chaired by Dick Jirus, is soliciting volunteers to serve on the various boards.
- Children's Chapel has resumed. Touchstones will involve the Lorax Project on April 19. Mission in Motion will be selling lasagna to cover mission trip expenses. Adult Forum discussion will focus on that Sunday's lectionary. Rev. Kendra is planning Saturday workshops for every other month. A Silent Saturday retreat may be held in May.
- Media Board needs new people for sound and video. If no one volunteers we may have some "dark Sundays" ahead of us.
- Membership is working to get sponsors more involved in integrating new members into the congregation.

- Fellowship reported that volunteers are needed for potlucks. After some discussion, Council recommended reducing the number of potlucks from monthly to quarterly, possibly with the new quarterly potlucks organized around a theme.
- Social Justice reported that issues of special concern will be noted in the *Editor* from time to time. The purpose of the notes will be to prepare members for letter writing campaigns. The Board is recruiting volunteers to work a booth or table at the next Gay Pride Weekend in June.
- Trustees reported on a number of projects they have underway – installing glass panels in the inner doors on the west side of the Narthex, finish painting room 4, installing new light ballasts in Baxter Hall, evaluating a proposal to install a security system on the front door, among other activities.
- By the time you read this, a number of important events have already happened, or will be happening shortly:
 - January 9 – Staff enjoyed their 2nd Annual Epiphany party with a white elephant gift exchange.
 - Kendra and Christine attended a clergy gathering to discuss race issues in the Quad Cities.
 - January 15-16 – Christine is attending a Quad Cities Interfaith Leadership Retreat on “Building the Foundation”.
 - January 17 – Christine is leading a Zentangle Playshop.
 - January 18 – Rekindling Our Congregation (ROC) team meeting will be held at Church, followed by a two-day leadership retreat on February 5 and 6.
 - January 25 – Membership Board is hosting a cocoa-tasting mixer.
 - January 26-28 – Kendra and Christine are attending a Minister’s Institute with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).
 - February 8 – Annual Meeting with chili dinner.
 - February 15 – Blessing of new officers and board members during morning worship service.
 - June 26-30 – Members are encouraged to attend the General Synod of the United Church of Christ when it meets in Cleveland, Ohio.
