From Our Pastor's Desk...

The month of February is always Black History Month, and every year I choose a book to read that will help to inform my understanding of the deeply complex issue of race in our nation. This year, I chose two.

One was *The Color of Water*, an autobiographical account of a black man who was raised by his white mother in the 1950's and 60's. It is a powerful reflection on the issues of race that are so deeply a part of our culture. I recommend it heartily.

The other one - which I am still reading - is an amazing history of African American women from the early colonial days until the present, called *A Shining Thread of Hope*. Did you know that in colonial days, 1/3 of the free men and women in New Orleans were African American? Or that many black women bought their way out of slavery and set up businesses that rivaled white establishments throughout the south? Every page of this book is filled with new information (for me) and a new appreciation for the strength of the human spirit as we seek to rise above the challenges of our lives. If you're a history buff, you'll find it fascinating.

This month we begin Lent, with all of its preparation for Easter. It, too, is a time of new learning, when we are invited to open ourselves to God's way

of seeing the world and ourselves. This year, I am excited about our Wednesday worship time. The theme - *Simple Living* - has been suggested by the Social Justice Board. The move to simplify our lives isn't just about the economy. It is a spiritual practice that can bear rich fruit in our lives and for the world. One of my favorite "bumper sticker" sayings is *Live simply so that others may simply live*. In this high-tech, 24/7 culture, many of us wish that life could be simpler, and all of us could use some new ideas to help jump-start our creativity.

Come and hear five different speakers lead a conversation about simplicity from their particular perspective. A Buddhist, a Unitarian, a Roman Catholic, a UCC minister, and a representative from the Labyrinth Project of the Quad Cities will each lead an evening, as we reflect together about the gifts and challenges of simplicity.

Each season of the church year presents a new opportunity for learning and growth. Come and explore the season of Lent!

Lenten Wednesdays

We all SAY we want a simple life, but very few of us really DO it. So this Lent, our Wednesday evening gatherings will focus on *SIMPLICITY* as a discipline of our faith and as a way of life that leads us toward the holy. Each week, we will hear from someone in the Quad Cities (from a variety of religious traditions) who is on a journey of simplicity.

Steve Spring is a member of the Buddhist community, and both teaches and practices mindfulness and meditation. Dr. Doug McCullum is a member of the Simplicity Group at the Unitarian Church, and is deeply concerned about the effect of our consumer culture on children and youth. Sr. Joan McCorkell is a member of the Carmelite monastic community in Eldridge, and she has spent her life teaching and practicing prayer. Rev. Janet Darmour-Paul is a UCC minister who, with her husband Tim, have raised two children with simplicity as a central value.

Our final Wednesday together will include an indoor Labyrinth walk, which is an ancient method of prayer that helps the walker find God's peace in the midst of the twists and turns of the path.



How much can we do to save energy in our homes?

Here are the answers to last month's PBS quiz.

1. In 2005 what percentage of the energy consumed by the United States came from renewable energy? 2%, 7%, 15% or 20%

Answer: Seven percent of the energy consumed in 2005 came from a renewable energy source.

Source: Energy Information Administration

2. On average, how much of the electricity used to power home electronics is consumed while electric products are turned off? 40%, 25% or 0%

Answer: According to the US Department of Energy, 25% of the electricity used by home electronics is consumed while the product is technically turned "off." This can be avoided by unplugging the appliance or by using a power strip with an off switch. **Source:** U.S. Dept. of Energy: Energy Saving Tips

3. If you replace 25% of your lights in high-use areas with compact fluorescent bulbs, how much can you save on your lighting energy bill? 50%, 25% or 10%

Answer: If you replace 25% of your lights in high-use areas with fluorescents, you can **save about 50%** of your lighting energy bill. If you use a fluorescent light bulb certified by the government program "Energy Star," the bulb will produce less heat and last about 10 times longer. **Source:** U.S. Dept. of Energy: Energy Solutions for Your Home

4. If every American home replaced just one light bulb with an energy efficient lightbulb, we would save enough energy to light more than 3 million homes for a year, and prevent greenhouse gases equivalent to the emissions of how many cars?

800,000 200,000 10,000

Answer: If every American home replaced just one light bulb with an Energy Star qualified bulb, we would cut greenhouse gases equivalent to the emissions of more than **800,000 cars**. **Source:** U.S. Environmental Protection Agency: Energy Star Program

5. Which type of refrigerator-freezer is most energy efficient?

Side-by-side model

Freezer on top model

Freezer on bottom model

Answer: Refrigerators with freezers on top use **10 to 15 percent less** energy than a side-by-side model of equivalent size. **Source:** National Resources Defense Council

6. What is the best method for reducing your personal computer's energy use?

Putting the computer in sleep mode

Activating the screen saver

Closing all open programs

Answer: There is a common misconception that screen savers reduce energy use by monitors; they do not. Automatic switching to sleep mode or manually turning monitors off is always the better energy-saving strategy. **Source:** U.S. Dept. of Energy: Energy Tips

7. Which household activity consumes the most water?

Dishwashing

Taking a bath

Washing clothes

Answer: Washing clothes consumes the most water. Consider buying an efficient, water-saving Energy Star model to reduce hot water use. **Source:** U.S. Dept. of Energy: Energy Savers Brochure

Winnie's Place is not just a shelter for women with or without children who are homeless or victims of violence. It is a shelter that provides opportunities for **growth, healing, learning and options that can benefit the clients for their lifetime.**

A story in a client's own words: "Before I came to Winnie's I lived with my sister. When I wasn't able to afford the rent, she kicked me out. I wasn't making enough money at my job; I only had five dollars in my bank account and still had a baby to raise. I was accepted into Winnie's Place. It felt different there. As time went by, I needed to set goals for myself, make a budget, and put in applications for apartments. I wasn't hearing from any apartment complexes, so I had to sit back and wait. When I had to make a budget it was hard because I was used to spending it. While I was at Winnie's I was able to accomplish a few things! My car payment was too high; I had no money in the bank, and still wasn't getting enough money on my checks from work. I was able to lower my car payment, save money and get earned income credit added to my check. Getting all these things done was great! But I still wasn't hearing any good news about an apartment. When I was there for two months and my leaving date was approaching I was asked to write another extension letter. After I turned in my letter, the next day I heard from my apartment complex that I live in now! I really thought I was going to be at Winnie's another month but everything came together. Some days I just wanted to give up and not do anything, but if I did that I wouldn't be where I am now, which is a two bedroom apartment in a nice neighborhood! **This is my story, B and son"**
