From Our Pastor's Desk...

These days, I have begun to shift into a “cleaning out” mode, in preparation for my departure at the end of June. It’s amazing what accumulates in the corners of an office after 15 years! Even with all the moving around that I did last year when we were working on the building, there are still many, many things to sort through and weed out. From books to sermons to all the cards and notes that you have sent over the years (yes, I saved every one of them)I am amazed at what has accumulated around me over the years.

I am also amazed that with every bit of cleaning out I do, my spirit feels a little lighter. It’s not just the drawers in my desk that have more space. It’s also the corners of my soul. It’s not just the bookshelves that have more room – it’s also my heart that feels more open to the new possibilities that lie ahead for me and for Edwards.

I find myself wondering a couple of things. First, I wonder how I will ever fit all this “stuff” into my small office at home that also doubles as my quilting space. And the answer is – I won’t. Which is why I’m cleaning out and paring down! Second, I wonder what the next occupant of the “pastor’s study” will put on these bookshelves and in these file drawers. And – of course – that answer will have to wait until there is a new pastor! But it will be fun to see.

We Americans are incredibly “stuff” oriented. We have stuff in our offices, we have stuff in every room of our homes, and we even have stuff in storage units because we can’t fit everything into one place. I recently read an article about the trend in our big cities toward smaller and smaller living spaces, with fold-away furniture so that the dining room could become the living room which could become the bedroom - all with very little effort. And that trend may grow, as the movement toward simpler living takes hold in our culture. But for now, I’m stuck with figuring out what to do with all this “stuff”!

Throughout this month at church, we will be celebrating the season of Easter. We’ll be reflecting on what it looks like to live a “resurrection life” – set free by the resurrection of Jesus Christ so that we can live in ways that are life-giving instead of life-taking. For Jesus, a big part of that was about “traveling light.” When you’re packing for a trip, the professional packers tell you to lay out everything you think you need – and then cut it in half! That’s not bad spiritual advice, either!

It is a real challenge for us to let go of the baggage that weighs us down. It’s hard to put down the emotional burdens of a difficult childhood or a bad marriage or caring for a loved one through a final illness. It’s almost impossible to set aside the expectations and demands of work or world or even home, in order to be able to hear God’s invitations and expectations. It requires discipline to live a life that is connected to people instead of to things or skills or success or failure. And that’s what a “resurrected life” is!

Resurrection life is a gift. It is grace. It is as open and fragrant as a hillside covered with spring flowers, and it is as full of awe as an organ concert in a great cathedral. So, I invite you to consider this question. What will you “weed out and set aside” this Easter....so that you can live a “risen and rising” life in the power and love of our Lord Jesus Christ? What would make your spirit lighter? What would make you laugh more? What would open your heart so that you can become an instrument of love and life in the world around you? Receive this gift of resurrection, and you will become an instrument of resurrection in the world! Say yes to this grace and new life will find you – when you least expect it!

Yom HaShoah Service Remembers the Holocaust

The word “remember” is really two words. It (literally) means to “re”-“member” or to make what is broken whole again. This year’s Holocaust Remembrance Service will take place on April 7th at 7:00 pm at Temple Emanuel. Each year, this service brings a featured speaker to the Quad Cities – someone who personally survived the Holocaust. This year’s speaker is Joe Koek, who now lives in Chicago. He was born in 1930 in The Hague, which was occupied by the Nazis in May of 1940. In 1943, when Joe was 13 years old, he and his sisters went into hiding to escape arrest. Their parents were arrested and sent to Auschwitz, where they died. The Underground moved him and his sisters from their original hiding place to safer ground in Holland, but in the process the siblings were separated. After the war, they were reunited at an orphanage for Jewish children, where Joe spent six years, before immigrating to the United States. Come and hear his story. Come and witness to the world that we will never forget. Come and learn what it really means to remember and find wholeness out of the broken pieces of history.

Mission...

MISSION 4/1 EARTH:

50 Great Days

Join Edwards for the UCC-wide *Mission 4/1 Earth Campaign*, which starts April 1st and ends fifty days later on May 19th, Pentecost. Those 50 great days of Eastertide are an opportunity for us to green up, power down, and shout out for Earth!

The goal for *Mission 4/1 Earth*?

- 100,000 trees planted
- 100,000 letters written on environmental concerns
- 1000,000,000 hours of Earth care

The goal for Edwards Congregational UCC?

- 50 trees planted
- 50 letters written
- 500 hours of Earth care

Each Sunday you will find *Mission 4/1 Earth Timecards* in the pew, where you can report your hours of earth care, letters, and trees planted. Completed cards are then place in the offering basket.

How will we reach 500 hours of engaged earth care?

Turn off your lights when you leave the house (gone 8 hours? That's 8 hours of earth care); plant and tend an organic garden (count the time you spend watering, weeding, etc); install energy efficient light bulbs and count the time it took to go get them and put them in; count the time it takes you to recycle each day; recycle your electronics at Scott County Recycling Center at Tremont and 53rd; count the hours of yard work you do with manual tools; donate your surplus items to a thrift store like Winnie's Wishes on River Drive and count the time it takes you to collect the items, drive to the store, and get back home.

Here are some more ideas for engaged Earth care...

Purchase fair trade coffee this month after church and count the time each day you spend enjoying your coffee (or chocolate)! Dump your coffee grounds in a compost pile or on acid loving plants and add that time, too.

Replace bottled water with a filtered pitcher and count the time you pour a glass of water each week, or try the tap water instead.

How about setting up a rain barrel or compost bin? How about replacing your lawn with drought resistant native plants? How about using only organic fertilizer? How about using vinegar and baking soda for cleaning instead of harsh chemicals?

Time spent reading articles or books on environmental issues counts, as well as time spend watching a documentary on the topic. On some Sundays after church, short videos will be shown in the library.

Time spent walking outdoors or picking up litter or picking up after your dog.

Also, the April 14th Potluck will be Local Food/Vegetarian. Time spent preparing and eating counts!

How will we plant trees? We will be taking orders for trees from Arbor Day Foundation for planting in your own yard. Volunteers will be happy to do the planting for you. Also, there may be an opportunity to purchase trees for planting around the globe.

What about the letters? The Social Justice Board will set up letter and email writing stations after church on a few of the Sundays, if you would like to engage in advocacy for pressing environmental issues such as climate change, Keystone XL pipeline, city bike lanes, and GMO labeling.
