From Our Pastor's Desk...

Memorial Day weekend always seems to kick off the season of summer. Walks on the riverfront, barbeques, long evenings sitting out on the deck... That is our dream for summertime. Rest, relaxation, renewal - it's a great dream!

For most of us, summer turns out very differently. Friends and relatives visit, there are family vacations to fit in, there are kids activities that fill up the days and the nights. It often feels like there are more "interruptions" than there is "routine". What used to be a break from everyday activities has turned into a continuous stream of events as we move from one thing to the next.

Time is much on our minds these days. Few of us have enough of it, even though the number of hours in the day hasn't changed. Many of us would give money before we would give our time. And we struggle to put more activity into less time each day.

In the Bible, there are two different kinds of time - kairos and chronos. Kairos is "God's time" - those holy moments that seem to last a lifetime but are over before you know it. The time when you are waiting for a new baby's birth is "kairos" time. The time when you sit quietly beside a lake and listen to the loons warble their haunting song through the early morning fog is "kairos" time. The time when you sit vigil and wait for a loved one's death is "kairos" time. Good worship is "kairos" time.

Chronos is "chronological time" - the slow steady march of seconds and minutes and hours and days and months and years

that makes up a lifetime. The time when you are waiting to be able to take your next pain medication is "chronos". The time when you are waiting to get test results back from the doctor is "chronos". The time when you are hurrying to work is "chronos".

Chronos time is exhausting. It is filled with details and schedules and things that we have to do. Kairos time renews us. It is filled with God's Spirit and it is time when details and schedules slip away into the background and all that matters is what is right in front of us.

I've always wanted to be able to turn chronos time into kairos time! But, these days, I think that kairos comes to us as a gift - in the midst of chronos. We have to look for it, we have to be ready for it, we have to prepare our hearts and our spirits to receive it. Then, when it comes, we can savor it.

We prepare ourselves for the gift of kairos in regular prayer and meditation, in worship, by singing hymns, and serving others. We prepare ourselves for the gift of kairos by practicing the faith that God has given us - in the midst of all the busyness and interruptions of our lives. We prepare ourselves for the gift of kairos by expecting it and watching for it - every day! May your summer be filled with both chronos AND kairos!

AN ANGEL STORY

I had borrowed a book on angels from Chaplain Jeanne Olsen with the Spiritual Care Department at Genesis Medical Center where I do volunteer work as a befriender. I was finding the book very interesting and was hoping it would provide me with some advice working with hospital patients as well as with myself and my wife Carol in our struggle with breast cancer. Carol is a breast cancer survivor and has battled numerous cancer recurrences over the past 13 years. A couple of weeks before yet another serious recurrence, I was reading a section in the book about angels, about how they are always around, but often we aren't aware of their presence and their support in the midst of the chaos that can be our lives. While I had not dismissed the idea of angels being real, I remember thinking that, assuming that angels are indeed around, it is really a shame that they can't communicate with us a *little* more directly. The book explained that angels can make themselves aware to people in different ways, and I remember thinking it is too bad that either I am too dense, or perhaps the angels around me are a bit too shy in making themselves known.

It was then that I glanced around the room with an ever so slight challenge to any angels who might be in the area to show themselves to me. Not really expecting to see anything dramatic, my gaze rested on a picture of my mom and dad. The picture is on the top of the secretary desk in our living room and has a mirror backdrop. My thoughts turned to the love I had always felt from my parents, and especially to my mother who had died 21 years previously. I again realized how angel-like she had been to me in my own faith journey as I was growing up. It was then that I glanced to the left of the picture to see the very distinct form of the breast cancer angel statue which Erica and Taylor Schroeder from our church had given Carol several years previously. (Erica herself is a breast cancer

survivor.) The angel statue reflection came from the ledge which was on the opposite wall from the secretary desk. I had never previously noticed the juxtaposition of the breast cancer angel reflection and my parent's picture from where I was sitting.

Was it happenstance that I was sitting just at the right angle, was it Jungian synchronicity, or new age type support of the universe at a time I would need sustenance? Whatever you may call it, I am firmly convinced it was a combination of God's grace manifested by the Holy Spirit's combining so many factors to come together in a nexus for me, to help prepare me and my wife Carol for the long haul in the breast cancer fight. In the midst of discouragement, Carol and I are heartened and sustained by God's grace manifested in this instance, by the support of our friends, our church, and our co-workers. I know now that both celestial as well as terrestrial angels are all about us. May we all open ourselves to God's ever-present sustaining love even in the valley of the shadow of death, for God's Grace does indeed abound! ~ Lyle






Update - Choir Robes
