There is an old story about a seeker who went to visit a holy person, hoping for enlightenment. The wise one invited the seeker in, and offered a drink of water. The holy person poured until the seeker's glass was full, and then kept pouring. The seeker watched until the water was pouring over the table, and then exclaimed, *"Stop! No more will go into the glass!"* And the holy one said, *"Like the glass, you are full of your own truths, ideas and opinions. You cannot be enlightened until you first empty your glass."*

We live in a time when we are "overfull". Our lives are running over with things to do - activities, lessons, camps, work, family... For many young families, there is not a moment in the day to sit and be "empty". Lots of people are just as full - but of worry and anxiety - as well as activity, and there is little room for what it God-given.

Much of our "fullness" is good. Family, friends, barbeques, a concert in the park, playing with children and grandchildren, loving our neighbors as ourselves... It is hard for us to accept that we can become overfull - even when it is all good.

I have always appreciated the image of a glass of water - poured to overflowing. It's one of those concrete images that helps to keep my life in balance. When there is too much being poured into my life, something has to be poured out for there to be room for anything else. When I am full to overflowing, I have to pour something out before there can be room for God's spirit and God's presence. It is true for us all.

This time in summer is a time of abundance and fullness. Tomatoes are ripening on the vine, the stands at the Farmer's Market are filled with wonderful vegetables and flowers, the firecrackers from Independence Day continue to randomly explode in the evenings, and the fireflies dance as darkness falls each night. At church, we are filled with all the goodness of fellowship and worship and service. In spite of the many, many struggles in the world, life is good.

Years ago, I spent a week in a retreat setting where we were all encouraged to carry a bowl with us through the day - an empty bowl. Over the course of that retreat, I learned to pray with that bowl in my hands - reflecting on its emptiness. I learned to put some of my "fullness" - the burdens and the sorrow, the joys and the anticipations - into that empty bowl for a little while each day. That way, when I came to God for help, wisdom and insight, there was room in my heart and mind for what God might have to offer me.

In the midst of the fullness of summer, I invite you to the practice of emptiness - every once in a while!


Strohbehn Scholarship






Biloxi Trip in September
