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Reflections...

Each summer our congregation sends its youth to serve as disciples of Christ in places often hidden in the margins and forgotten by mainstream culture.

This year 6 young people and 4 adults traveled to Green Grass, South Dakota, on the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation, for a week of children's programming and extensive repair on the community church. We worked from early morning till dark, serving meals, peeling paint, listening to stories, understanding history, laughing with children, running from snakes, dodging grasshoppers, and marveling at the indiscernible beauty of wild horses grazing on rolling hills.

This year's trip was not the first time Edwards had sent youth to Green Grass, but six years of spiraling unemployment, a staggering increase in suicide and addiction, the death of the church pastor, and neglect of the church building had dramatically changed the face of this tiny community. What we found was nothing like what we had prepared for and so much of our experience at Green Grass will be remembered by what was not expected.

Our youth, Elizabeth Knoche, Jessica Rind, Penny Hubbard, Laura Beck, John Chesley and Bryce Kelly each had their own vision of what the week would look like. The adults, Molly

Sartorius, Lyle Stratton, Richard Jirus, and Susan Chesley, also had expectations but ours were perhaps a little more realistic. Whatever our preconceived vision, we all agreed that nothing matched our expectations. Perhaps the greatest surprise for all was the way the people of the Green grass community changed our hearts. Sincere affection is more often than not unexpected and we were surprised each day by the way the families in this small community invited us into their lives and how much, despite appearances, we actually had in common. Much of what we saw or expected fell away as we understood that at our core we are all just human, children of God, one family.

We wish to express our deep gratitude to our Edwards' family for giving us the opportunity to serve God and to share what we have with others. We returned to Davenport much richer than when we left and holding a grander appreciation of how God's spirit moves over the face of all creation. Hopefully, the relationships we developed can continue and our community and congregation can remain united with the community and congregation of Green Grass.

- ✍ God is in the nursery. The Bible has specific promises about God's presence when children are welcomed and loved in Jesus' name.
- ✍ The church nursery is the first contact young families may have with our church. Your friendly greeting and exceptional care for their children can make a great first impression. If they don't feel like their children are safe, they will not return - and rightly so.
- ✍ The first (and sometimes lasting) feelings a child will have toward church is formed in the nursery.
- ✍ When you serve in the nursery, you are being entrusted with the most important (and vulnerable) members of the church family.
- ✍ Your service in the church nursery allows church goers to focus on worship, rather than worrying about their children. In a very real sense your ministry makes it possible for Pastor Katherine to fulfill her ministry.
- ✍ Your service is essential for your own spiritual growth. You may have never looked at it this way, but a *growing* Christian is always a *servicing* Christian. Jesus was known for putting others first, when you serve in the church nursery you are walking in his example.



Would You Like to Cook or Serve a Meal to the Hungry?

Edwards sponsors an evening meal at the community meal site in the Salvation Army building on the corner of 6th and Harrison Streets in Davenport. Approximately 60-70 hungry, often homeless persons are served a nourishing meal prepared in our church kitchen and transported to be served. This is done six times a year on the 3rd Tuesday of even-numbered months. Food is purchased with funds from Edwards' mission budget.

Kitchen volunteers work together to prepare the meal during the early afternoon at Edwards. Martha Jirus plans the menu and food purchases. Food preparation begins at 2:00pm and takes about 2 hours (with time for a friendly coffee break). Volunteers arrive at Edwards by 5:30pm to load, transport, and setup at the meal site. A grace precedes the food service, which starts at 6pm and takes about 30-40 minutes. Most volunteers are done by 6:45pm. Two are needed to return to Edwards with two pans to be washed.

Thoughts from the Caregiver Coordinator

Dr. Rhonda Montgomery and Dr. Kosloski have studied care giving and the stress that is associated with being a care giver. They have found that the young adult or the spouse who is now the care giver of a family member, feels as if they are the parent and not the adult child, sibling, or spouse. *The source of distress is not the activity itself, but how the caregiver feels about it.* The authors have presented examples of caregivers who are experiencing stress.

No Way Nasturtium: Caregivers Who Are Highly Committed

Story: Mrs. Nasturtium has been caring for her husband with multiply medical problems for five years. Their three children help when she requests it but she does not like to impose on them. They have been spending more time at home since Mrs. Nasturtium's husband became ill. They play cards, watch TV and talk about the news. Her husband needs more help now with getting dressed and bathing. He is very particular about how tasks should be done and is starting to show signs of dementia.

Mrs. Nasturtium has concerns about her husband's judgment but has resisted taking over tasks like paying the bills. This sometimes creates tension between them. He insists on paying their bills and will not ask for help. Creditors have called twice about missing payments. Mrs. Nasturtium loves her husband and will do whatever she needs to take care of him. However she gets frustrated. She is not sleeping well at night and is losing weight. She will not listen to their children's suggestions to move him into a care facility.

Description: Caregivers in this situation experience high levels of stress because of changes in their partners' abilities and greater needs for care and support. The caregiver may feel anxious, angry or frustrated about assuming new roles their partners performed in the past. They may also find that care giving interrupts other aspects of their lives, such as having a job or raising a family.

In general, these are people who enjoy providing care, but they struggle with the demands of care giving. They have no intention of giving up their care giving role in the near future, nor do they plan to move their partners into another setting. This group is at great risk for developing physical and mental health problems.

Suggestions to lower stress:

1. Ask for help from your friends and family so that all the care giving is not on your shoulders. Using this story as an example, perhaps the eldest child could sit down with their dad and "help" dad pay the bills. Perhaps a friend could take Mr. Nasturtium out for coffee and allow Mrs. Nasturtium time at home to rest or do needed things in the home.
2. Take time off to do things you enjoy doing, call a friend and visit, read a book, write poetry, journal, take a nap, read the Psalms, go out for a walk, go out for coffee, or go out window shopping; just get out for a while.
3. Change the expectations we have of ourselves. We may not be able to do everything we used to do when we were in our 20's or even in our 50's. We may be young at heart, but our bodies are getting mature!
4. Remember God is on this journey with you. Talk with God, share your heart, your hurts, and your hopes; then listen and look for God's response.

Do you find yourself in this story? If so, I hope you will find this information helpful in reducing your stress and that it will help you cope as you are on this journey with your loved one. Next month we will meet Placement Posey and hear her story.


