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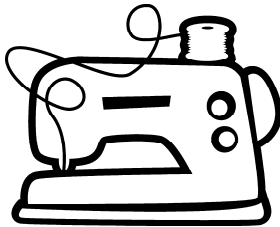

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## *From Our Pastor's Desk...*

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**T**hese days, Edwards stands on the brink of a huge amount of change. We are now deep into the process of working with the architect to finalize plans before we put our project out for construction bids. For the next year we are all going to be in the middle of LOTS of changes.

Here's a list of a few of the things that I expect will happen at least once over the course of the coming year:

\*We will misplace at least one important thing - probably more. \*We will probably host a funeral lunch in the midst of remodeling the kitchen. \*We will have different opinions about simple things like carpet colors and bathroom fixtures, as well as significant issues like contractors and labor contracts. \*We will clean out lots of cupboards and file drawers, making many trips to Goodwill and the recycle center. And in the midst of all the piles....something will get thrown out that we will wish we had saved. \*We will all feel a bit "discombobulated" and displaced as "the way things have always been" shifts and moves and finds a new place.

So, what do we do about all that? Well, I don't think there is any one thing we can do that will magically make this deconstruction and reconstruction process go perfectly. Wouldn't it be nice if we could! It may help to remember some simple things about life together in a community.

1) **Be patient!** Change is hard on everyone. Let's try to be patient with one another, with consultants and with contractors - trusting that when we are finished, the end result will be as wonderful as the end result of our Capital Campaign.

2) **Never forget that we share a common goal!** There may be different ideas about how we get from here to there, but we all want the same end result - a quality building that will provide a warm welcome to each and every person who drives up our driveway.

3) **If you have a concern about something, talk to the people who can do something about it!** Speak to someone from the Building Task Force. Raise a question with the Moderator. Talk to me. Try to refrain from "parking lot meetings" and coffee hour complaints! Concerns can't be addressed unless they are raised with the church leadership, and we welcome your comments, suggestions and ideas. If you want clarification about something - just ask!

4) **Pray!** Pray for our church community. Pray for our church leaders. Pray for the people you disagree with. Pray for the people who are turning our dreams into realities.

5) **Participate!** Things may get a bit awkward for a while, as we work around one project or another, and it may seem easy to stay home for a while. But we need your participation in the programs that make Edwards a great place. Your presence makes a difference.

6) **Remember!** This is all temporary, and when we are finished it will be a wonderful reminder for us all that DREAMS REALLY DO COME TRUE (just not without a lot of hard work and sacrifice!).

### The Resolution

On July 17<sup>th</sup>, we met in a Special Congregational Meeting to approve a resolution to move ahead with construction work. The resolution that was passed at that meeting can be summarized:

We have received Capital Campaign pledges totaling over \$1,250,000 over a five-year period from June 2011 to June 2016.

We are allocating \$1,210,000 for the anticipated projects. Construction will begin in the fall of 2011, to be completed by the fall of 2012.

SGGM Architects will prepare the plans and specs for bids.

The construction will be financed through Capital Campaign income and bank borrowing. Principal and interest payments will be made from capital campaign pledge income, and will not extend beyond June 30, 2016. We expect that the total amount we will need to borrow will not exceed \$650,000.

A separate account will be set up for all capital income and expenditures. No capital funds will be co-mingled with operating funds.

### The Timeline

So what's next?! For the next month there will be a lot of "behind-the-scenes" work going on. The Task Force will be meeting, our land will be surveyed, soil tests will be taken, and Greg Gowey, the architect, will be drawing up the construction documents.

We expect that everything will be ready for construction bids to begin on September 6<sup>th</sup>, and that bids will be due on September 27<sup>th</sup>.

We will "break ground" during worship on Sunday October 2<sup>nd</sup>, and construction will begin soon after that. The hope is that the building will be enclosed by the time it is too cold to work outside, and that the interior work will progress through the winter.

We expect to finish the projects by the end of July, 2012!!!!

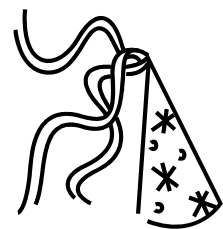

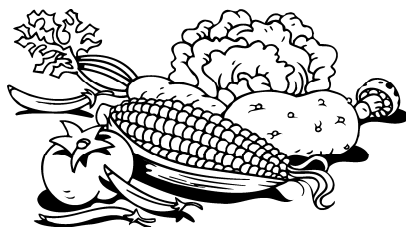
## CROP WALK

## South Dakota Partnership
