Congregational Meeting

September 17th, we will gather in a Special Meeting of the congregation to discuss options for carpeting the sanctuary, the narthex, the offices and the parlor. The current carpeting is over 15 years old, and showing its age! Since carpet is an oil-based product, its cost is increasing as the cost of oil increases.

The Trustees have chosen a \$21,000 bid for carpet and tile under the pews in the sanctuary (which are also showing their age), and we currently have about \$13,000 raised to pay the bill. The Church Council is bringing two proposals for the congregation to consider. Proposal One is to only do what we have the cash to do (which probably means leaving the sanctuary alone). Proposal Two is to do the whole job now, and borrow the money we need.

Borrowing money requires a vote of the congregation, and a quorum is required for a vote! Please plan to attend - your perspective and your vote matters.







Adult Mission Trip to Biloxi, Mississippi

Our time for the adult mission trip to Biloxi, Mississippi, to help with the damage from Hurricane Katrina last year is rapidly approaching. The dates for this trip are that we will leave Davenport on Saturday, October 28, spend a night somewhere around Memphis, arrive in Biloxi on Sunday afternoon, October 29, work October 30 thru November 3, pack and leave on Saturday, Nov 4, stay overnight in (TBD), and arrive back home the afternoon of Sunday, November 5.

Our work partners and trailer mates for the week will be a group from a UCC church in Tolland, Connecticut. In addition to this group, the BBM has plans for a "Blitz" of around 200 people to be working in the area. We and the group from Tolland have the use of the quarters provided by BBM. Interestingly, the Millard Fuller Foundation (Fuller is the founder of Habitat for Humanity) is also planning a "Blitz" for the same period, though not necessarily on the Mississippi gulf coast. Apparently it has taken a year to determine the razing and construction that can happen in this storm ravaged area, but now they are ready to go!

In early September we will need to comprise a firm roster of those who want to take part in our trip. Those who go will be asked to fill out a skills inventory sheet that will be provided to Back Bay Mission so that they can match the work at hand with the skills available. Those who go will need to have

current Tetanus shots. We will also need to determine whether there will be sufficient private vehicles available for the trip (with expenses reimbursed, of course), or whether rental vehicles will be needed. With a firm roster established (12-13 people) we will probably have some planning sessions scheduled to firm up plans for travel, sustenance, work activity readiness, and whatever else will need to be addressed. Our funding is already covered by the mission trips auction held earlier this year.

If you want to take part in this mission trip, be sure to let Dick Werner (441-9730) know, even if you mentioned your interest to him earlier.
