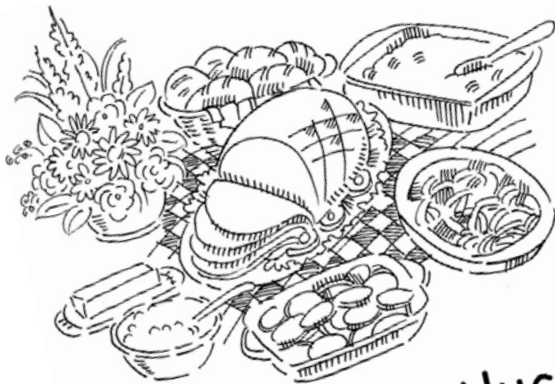

From Our Pastor's Desk...

Thanksgiving has always been my favorite holiday. Maybe it's because I grew up in New England and the story of the Pilgrims landing at Plymouth Rock in the late fall (br-rr-rr), having to figure out how to feed and house themselves through that long winter seemed all too vivid and gripping. Maybe it's because our whole family would gather at my grandparents' house for a celebration that always seemed magical to me. Maybe it's because the smells of Thanksgiving are so pungent - turkey and gravy and pies (our sense of smell is deeply connected to our emotional memory). Who knows! All I know is that I love Thanksgiving.

Every year at Thanksgiving we all spend a little time reflecting on the things for which we are thankful. Maybe that's why I like Thanksgiving better than Christmas - at Christmas we spend time reflecting on the things we wish we had rather than on the bounty we already have!

But it's not enough to just sit back and reflect on all the bounty in our lives. God asks us to share that bounty with others - graciously and generously.

It is not enough to say that I am grateful for a home that I love (and I am). Too many people are homeless (700 youth in the Quad Cities at any one time) or live in substandard housing. We are asked to do more than sit comfortably on our couch. We are also asked to help others find their way home.

It is not enough to say that I am grateful for my health, and for health insurance and for access to top quality medical care (which I am). Too many people in our nation do not have health, do not have health insurance or access to good care. We are asked to do more than be grateful for our own good fortune. We are asked to find ways to share that with brothers and sisters throughout our country.

It is not enough to say that I am grateful for an abundance of food, or work that is meaningful, or a family that gets along (most of the time) - which I am. Too many people in these times struggle with basic necessities and are out of work and their families are stressed to the breaking point. We are asked to be more than grateful - we are asked to share our abundance, to search for ways to help get people working again, and to find ways to support family structures.

The discipline of "giving thanks" is terribly important in our faith tradition. We come to God - every day - to give thanks for what we have received, to give thanks for the faith that sustains us, to give thanks for the earth that brings forth beauty and bounty and nourishment, to give thanks for a church community, and to give thanks for the saints around us who both challenge and comfort us. Giving thanks is the path that leads us to God's heart. It is also the path that leads us to places of real need, to places of turmoil and fear, to people who need helping hand.

In this season of Thanksgiving, I invite you to give thanks - regularly. Count your blessings every day. And then figure out a way to share them with the world. The funny thing is that you will find that when you share your blessings with others, you'll have more at the end of the day than when you started! God's arithmetic isn't like ours! Happy Thanksgiving!

What the Bible Says

The Bible says three things about how much we should give back to our faith community, in gratitude for all that God has done for us.

- 1) The Hebrew Scriptures speak of "first fruits" giving, in which what is shared comes "off the top" - a good reminder that, before all else, God and what God does for us is our first priority.
- 2) The Hebrew Scriptures teach the tithe - the giving of 10% of our income for God's purposes in the world.
- 3) The New Testament, especially St. Paul, asks that we go beyond tithing to teach proportionate giving, meaning the more we have, the more we should give.

The Bible sets a high standard for giving, ourselves what will work in our budgets. But remember that the Bible sets a high standard for lots of things! Love our enemies, forgive those who have harmed us, keep the Sabbath....these are all deep challenges which shape our living even when we aren't perfect.

The best response to high standards is not to give up on them, but to ask for God's grace and guidance to help us grow toward them. If 10% is not possible for your family, find a percentage that will work, and give it "off the top" for God's work in the world. Trust that God will take your gift and multiply it in ways that are hard to imagine.

Stewardship Sunday

Sunday, November 8th will be the day that we dedicate our estimates of giving for 2010 in worship. Every year, as our estimates come in, the Trustees are faced with the challenge of building a budget that will match the church's giving. Every year we ALMOST make it, and the leadership feels compelled to bring a deficit budget to our Annual Meeting in January. Every year, we seem to make up the difference and we end up with a balanced budget at the end of the year - or even a surplus. Let's make 2010 be the year when we go over the top - from the very beginning! Your generous giving makes all the difference!

How much we give is determined by our sense of how much we have received. Everything scripture says about giving is in the context of what God has first given us. And what has God given us? Our next breath. Life itself. God's love to know joy and hope through all of life and death. Life eternal. Confidence that no trouble we know, not even the worst evil, can defeat the goodness God wants in and for us.

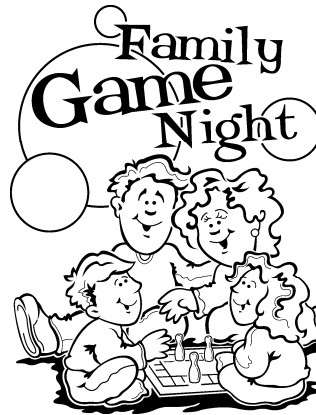
Intergenerational Advent Celebration

Health Care Reform Update

Many thanks to the members of the Sunday adult forum for inviting me back on October 18 to give an update on health care reform issues and events. The on-going interest from people at Edwards is very encouraging, both now -- as health care reform moves forward nationally -- and for the future, when we will need to continue the push for quality, affordable health care for everyone in this country.

Among the items we covered on Sunday were some new studies that 1) quantified the exploding dollar costs facing us if we do not enact significant national reform now (Urban Institute) and 2) a new Harvard study estimating that 45,000 people die every year because they lack health insurance. This equals 123 people who die every day. We also explored some international perspectives on the current U.S. efforts at health care reform. There seemed to be strong agreement with the idea that significant reform this year that, among other outcomes, markedly expands the number of people covered will move us more closely into the community of nations, where we can work with the other developed nations to find ways to tackle common problems such as aging populations, increases in mental illness and obesity, and the costs of new medical technology. ~ Karen Metcalf
