Ministerial Musings...

Since my first conversation with the Search Committee I continue to hear from so many of you, stories of why Edwards UCC is your church home. From some I have heard about growing up in the United Church of Christ here or elsewhere. But it's true, that these days, you don't hear much about denominational loyalty. I include myself in that camp; I grew up in the American Baptist church –though still with congregational roots. My journey to the UCC was like that of so many that I have heard. “Who knew a church like this was even out there?” My passion for issues of social justice, while fueled by my religious convictions, often seemed politely side-stepped by the church.

Then there was a full-page ad in the New York Times by the UCC proudly proclaiming its ordination of openly gay ministers. I don't remember exactly when or what church or churches sponsored it, but I saw it at a time when I needed that kind of support in my own calling to ministry. As a woman, married to a woman, I knew I had found a church home where my faith and my passion for social justice would no longer be side-stepped.

“The UCC story is broad and diverse and a story that we celebrate. With all Christians, we rest in God's amazing grace and hear God's voice in the words of Scripture. Yet, the UCC is unique to some because we do not require uniformity of belief. We are a church of open ideas, extravagant welcome, and evangelical courage. Our passion for democracy extends to both government and church, where decision-making rests within each congregation. We support liberty in our pulpits, just as we affirm the individual conscience of our 1.2 million members to agree, disagree, and wrestle with life's biggest questions in a spirit of love. Our unity is not dependent upon uniform agreement, but in our shared allegiance to Jesus Christ. Ours is a risk-taking church, because ours is a risk-taking God.” (ucc.org)

In general, the stories I hear from you about why Edwards UCC is your church home, like mine, are not tame and ordinary, they are moving, thoughtful and even sometimes heartbreaking. Some of you came out of churches hurt and burdened by what you had experienced there. Others have come to Edwards with little or no church experience. Some of you have responded to the extravagant welcome of the UCC and have genuinely found that at Edwards. Let us *celebrate* together the wonderful faith community that we have all found here, the safe-haven, the place to bring our children to be taught about a loving God, where we can worship in many ways, hearing many voices and find a diversity of names for God.

Let us celebrate together the wonderful faith community that we are all a part of here! Every member and friend of the church that joins us regularly for worship or any activity, plays a part in the life of this community. November is the month when we think about STEWARDSHIP – that is how we use the gifts that God has given us to glorify God and continue ministries of this church. Each one of us has been given gifts of TIME, SKILLS & TALENTS, and (yep, you guessed it) MONEY. Recall what it was about Edwards UCC that made it feel like your faith home when you came here, tell your story to someone else, recall what makes Edwards special to you. Then consider all that goes into making Edwards UCC the place that it is – ministers and other staff, buildings and grounds, paper and copiers, fabric and candles, banners and bibles.

Did you know that there are people in the Quad Cities that haven't heard about the EXTRAVAGANT WELCOME of EDWARDS UCC? Did you know that there are people longing for a place where they can bring their children to learn about a loving God, where they can experience vibrant worship and moving music? Where they can be a part of a faith community that engages both their heart and mind? In the same way that Edwards UCC welcomed you, let us now bring our gifts to serve one another, build up and sustain this faith community and spread the news that all are welcome here.

Church Council Highlights...

Highlights of the October Church Council Meeting

This is a new feature in the Editor to inform the congregation about what is discussed in the Council meeting. Members of the congregation are always welcome to attend the council meeting or request a complete copy of the minutes from Kathy Bowerman.

PASTOR'S REPORT: There were weddings in the Chapel on October 4 and 7. The Confirmation class received an award for the design of their cardboard yurt at "Night at the Shelter" on October 4. Christine met with Rabbi Karp and Rev. Jay Wolin regarding the Thanksgiving Service to be held at Temple Emanuel. *Christine plans to have two presentations about her involvement in the *Women Touched by Grace* workshops.

TREASURER'S REPORT: (Elisabeth Norwood) In addition to the original budget deficit of \$8,085, non-pledge income is about \$8,000 below the anticipated level and pledges are \$4,000 below. We should avoid additional spending when possible. As examples, members will bring desserts in lieu of purchasing a large cake for Christine's installation and Edwards will not place a newspaper ad for the Christmas Eve services this year.

Council approved the following to help reduce the budget deficit:

\$2,621 from the Trustees Reserve Fund to the General Fund

\$2,700 from the Building Maintenance Reserve Fund to the General Fund

\$1,000 by not contributing to the Sabbatical Fund in 2013

\$1,000 (anticipated) from the proceeds of the Cookie Walk

This total of \$7,321 would be applied to reduce the deficit.

If all pledges were increased by only 8.33%, our budget would be balanced.

SHARING THE VISION: Of the \$708,000 anticipated to date, \$701,000 has been received.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: (Marilyn Riedesel) The Cookie Walk will be December 1, with no chili lunch because Christine's installation is the same day. SERRV items will be available beginning on December 1.

MEDIA: (Woody Perkins) There is a blog on our home page, which will be available during the Biloxi Trip. Volunteers are needed to operate the video equipment during Sunday services.

MEMBERSHIP: (Tim Huey) On October 27 a membership class will be held for 8 - 12 people.

MISSION: The sign honoring Clyde Durrah was carried by the Crop Walk group.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE: (Shirley Johnson) On November 17 a Stewardship Fair will be held in Baxter Hall with tables for each of the boards.

SEARCH COMMITTEE: (Shirley Johnson) Interactive meetings with Christine will be held November 3 and December 15.

TRUSTEES: (Vince Holdridge) The west entry canopy supports have structural issues and will be rebuilt.

SOCIAL JUSTICE: (Judy Collins) Nominations are being sought by December 1 for the All My Relatives Award.

WORSHIP: (John Keraus) Christmas Eve services will be at 5 p.m. and 8:30 p.m.



Financial Statistics through September

In January, the congregation approved a budget with a full-year deficit of \$8,085. Through September, non-pledge income is running \$8,300 below the budget, bringing the base deficit to \$16,385. There have been a number of other changes in income and expenses, including savings from not having a full-time Music Director and Organist over the summer. In addition, Council has authorized the use of the Trustees Reserve Fund and some of the Building Maintenance Fund to help cover current expenses. However, the current forecast is still for a full-year deficit.

GreenFaith Announces 2014 Fellowship Program Class National Initiative Trains Religious Leaders for Environmental Leadership

Over the past decade, the religious-environmental movement has grown dramatically, with more and more religious institutions addressing environmental concerns. One of the engines of that growth has been the GreenFaith Fellowship Program, the world’s only comprehensive education and training program to prepare lay and ordained leaders from diverse religious traditions for environmental leadership. Since 2008, GreenFaith has trained over 115 Christian, Jewish, Muslim, Hindu, Buddhist and Unitarian leaders for environmental leadership.

GreenFaith has announced that **Lisa Hixon, a member of Edwards Congregational United Church of Christ in Davenport**, has been accepted into the Fellowship Class of 2014. Lisa Hixon will join 22 classmates from religious traditions including Muslim, Hindu, Evangelical, Roman Catholic, mainline Protestant, and Unitarian Universalist. Members of this class of Fellows work in a wide variety of settings, including congregations, universities, environmental and religious NGO’s, denominational organizations, and businesses. ***“I’m looking forward to joining the Fellowship community,” said Lisa Hixon. “I’m deeply concerned about the threats facing the planet, and believe that religious communities can make an important impact. I want to contribute to that movement.”***

“We’re thrilled to welcome these new Fellows into the Program,” said Rev. Fletcher Harper, GreenFaith’s Executive Director. “We look forward to working with them to support their growth as religious-environmental leaders.”

Through three residential retreats, monthly webinars, and extensive reading, the Fellows will receive education and training in eco-theology, “greening” the operation of religious institutions, environmental advocacy, and environmental justice. Each Fellow writes their own eco-theological statement and carries out a leadership project in their community, mobilizing religious leaders in relation to an environmental issue. Upon graduating, they will join the Fellowship’s alumni network and mentor other emerging leaders in this field.

Harper directs the Program, with support from a multi-faith and multi-disciplinary faculty. “This program will offer these leaders the opportunity to become well-trained leaders in religious environmentalism.” said Harper. “They will help create an environmentally just and sustainable world.”

GreenFaith is an interfaith environmental coalition whose mission is to educate and mobilize diverse religious communities for environmental leadership. Founded in 1992, GreenFaith is a leader in the fast-growing religious-environmental movement and has won national and international recognition for its work.
